

DOING WHAT WE CAN IN SOUTH AFRICA

As we drove into Paarl East, the wooden pallets piled with corrugated metal and chain-link fencing reminded me of the make-shift homes I've seen in Tijuana, Costa Rica, or the Philippines. The ingenuity of building materials always impresses me. We're invited into a courtyard that has an assortment of chair, bins, and boxes for seating. And then Pastor Danny greets those who are gathered. They sing worship songs that are familiar to me. Pastor Danny challenges the moms to raise their children knowing Jesus because that is the one true way to rise above their circumstances. He prays for them with such passion and dependency on God. And then a line forms—the children first with siblings assisting their younger brothers or sisters. The women are next. If any food is left, the men will eat. It's September 2019 and a moment in my life that I will never forget.

This past Monday South Africa celebrated Freedom Day. April 27, 1994 marked the first post-apartheid election for a country on its way to healing. I was a teenager in 1994. South Africa's apartheid ended during my lifetime. I realized this past September that the country is still healing and has a long way to go. There are grave inequalities that can plainly be seen in beach-front

properties and miles of shanty towns, luxury sports cars and walking to get places, comfortably staying safe at home and the impossibility of social distancing.

April has been devastating. As with much of the world, South Africa has gone into lockdown. It has been an inconvenience and hardship for many of us. For the poorer communities in South Africa and around the world, it is life or death. The ability to work, means adults can purchase food. The ability to attend school, means children can count on a meal. When work and school are removed from the equation, hunger becomes a dire reality. In South Africa, this has set into motion looting, riots, and seeking help wherever possible.





We are so incredibly proud of the Outside the Bowl South Africa team. They have shifted from cooking thousands of hot nutritious meals to putting together family meal packs. These boxes are being distributed by ministry partners and schools. They're also shifting from producing 200 serving bags of Vita Kidz Porridge to family-size bags holding 20 servings. These bags are being filled by hand (pictured above) since the existing equipment cannot do the job.

Right now Outside the Bowl is raising funds for additional equipment which will speed up the process and get more food out to families in need.
